³Sentence length does not include extended sentence or any additional sentencing factors that extend beyond the single holding offense class, including life sentences.

⁴ Admission to IDOC during each calendar year (January 1 - December 31).

⁵ Court admission is defined as an adult admitted from criminal court who was not on MSR/Parole when the crime occurred.

⁶ A new offense violation is defined as an adult who was on MSR/Parole and has been convicted of a new offense that is different from their current holding offense.

⁷ A technical violation is defined as an adult on MSR/parole readmitted because of an MSR/parole rule violation or readmitted with new charges pending.

BOther is defined as an adult admitted to IDOC custody for something other than an MSR/Parole violation, including admission from other custody or violation of some other form of release.

⁹ Sex offender registrants are defined as inmates required to register as a sex offender for having a sex offense or a murderer/violence against youth offense on the sentencing order; excluding prostitution.

^{*} End of CY population is the population on the last day of the Calendar Year, December 31st.

^{**} In December, 2015 IDOC initiated a major IT transition, moving from a DOS-based offender tracking system to a modern, web-based tracking system.
