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Note: In December, 2015 IDOC initiated a major IT transition, moving from a DOS-based offender tracking system to a modern, web-based tracking system. During the transition, some traditional measures will contain missing values due to a combination of factors, which include quality control issues with data entry and missing data for fields that are no longer required within the system. In addition, basic coding and program logic is still being reviewed and corrected. Moving forward, the Department continues to validate certain data measures and all elements are subject to change as more information becomes available. - ¹³Essential Learning provides support in multiple curricular areas as needed in order to be successful in the High School Equivalency course.
- ¹⁴Financial Literacy I and II give an introduction to personal finance and economy.
- ¹⁵Grammar Review helps students improve their language and writing skills through the in-depth study of sentence structure, punctuation, spelling, parts of speech, and capitalization.
- ¹⁶Illinois History teaches history of the state, along with practical info about civil, consumer, and voting rights.
- ¹⁷Interpersonal Skills I and II examine nine essential interpersonal skills to compare and explore them through the lives of historical figures and stories.
- ¹⁸Keyboarding introduces students to proper use of a keyboard as well as basic grammar.
