In accordance with the Unified Code of Corrections, Acting Director Latoya Hughes respectfully submits the following information regarding the Data Governance and Organization to Support Equity and Racial Justice Report.

(20 ILCS 65/20-15) ([P.A. 102-0543](#))

Sec. 20-15. Data Governance and Organization to Support Equity and Racial Justice.

(f)(a) On or before July 1, 2022 and each July 1 thereafter, the Board and the Department shall report statistical data on the racial, ethnic, age, sex, disability status, sexual orientation, gender identity, and primary or preferred language demographics of program participants for each major program administered by the Board or the Department.

The Act requires the Illinois Department of Corrections to “report statistical data on racial, ethnic, age, sex, disability status, sexual orientation, gender identity, and primary or preferred language demographics of program participants for each major program” administered by the Illinois Department of Corrections. “Major program” is not defined by the statute so the Department has adopted the following definition provided by the Governor’s Office of Management and Budget: a major program is a program with an enacted appropriation of greater than \$1 million in each fiscal year; direct services provided to individuals and/or a reasonable expectation that demographic information can be aggregated via proxy data without substantial cost or disruption to program delivery. The Illinois Department of Corrections has further defined “program participants” as individuals in the custody and control of the Illinois Department of Corrections. Using these definitions, the Department has identified the following programs and program participant populations for review to fulfill the required statutory mandate:

- Mental health treatment
- Substance abuse treatment
- Parole reentry
- Education programming
- Southwestern & Sheridan drug/alcohol treatment programs

Data for this report is contained in the Department’s tracking system of record. Additional/updated programming for our tracking system of record has been requested for data that is not able to be extracted and manipulated in accordance with mandates required for this report.
